#### Rain biggest factor in flooding

An engineering firm studying the Tsolum River concludes the amount of rainfall, especially extreme rain, is the most important factor in whether flooding will occur.

And it looks like we've entered a period of increasingly heavy rainfall in this region, Graham Hill added Tuesday in a report to the Comox Valley Regional District.

In the wake of serious flooding in East Courtenay on Nov. 16, 2009 and Dec. 24, 2010, the CVRD commissioned Northwest Hydraulic Consultants to study and report back.

Many rivers on the east side of Vancouver Island from Duncan to Port Hardy - including

#### FLOODPLAIN GUIDELINES

New guidelines were released this week to help B.C.'s coastal communities update floodplain area maps and

adapt to rising sea levels.

The report, Coastal Floodplain Mapping Guidelines and Specifications, recommends standards for topographic mapping and identifies engineering requirements for establishing building elevations in coastal areas. It also includes a sample floodplain map showing potential floodplain areas to the year 2100, along with an engineering design brief.

This information will help urban planners and local government officials incorporate rising sea levels into flood-hazard area land-development decisions, such as official community plans, zoning, subdivisions and building

permits.

The work has been made possible by a \$60,000 contribution from the province and Natural Resources Canada's Regional Adaptation Collaborative Program, which facilitates climate change adaptation planning and decisionmaking at the regional level.

The new guidelines complement a report released last May on how rising sea levels will affect coastal B.C. over

the next century.

#### Miracle cure kills fifth patient

#### By The Associated Press

A fifth volunteer died Tuesday from an experimental drug touted as a miracle cure for hepatitis B, beyond medical rescue even as scientists unraveled the mystery of what went gravely wrong in a clinical trial.

Agonizingly, the first clue was in plain sight a year ago, but researchers at the National Institutes of Health didn't know enough about how the drug worked to recognize what it meant, the study's lead scientist says.

"Something terrible happened and we missed it," Dr. Jay Hoofnagle said in an emotional interview describing the horror of realizing the drug was killing people months after they stopped taking it.

"The dreadful thing [is] waiting to see what will happen," he
said, his voice trembling, before
learning of the most recent
death. "I just hope we're over the
worst."

The drug Fialuridine, or FIAU, had shown great promise for fighting the hepatitis B virus, which can cause deadly cirrhosis and liver cancer. When dogs passed toxicity tests unharmed, the Food and Drug Administration approved FIAU for human trials.

Too late, scientists would discover that in humans, FIAU stealthily attacks the very building blocks of cells in livers, kidneys and nerves.

Five people treated with FIAU have died of liver and kidney failure, despite liver transplants for three of them. On Tuesday, a 37-year-old woman succumbed after two months in critical condition and two liver transplants at the University of Virginia Medical Center. One volunteer remains in serious condition there, and another is recovering from an Aug. 4 transplant at Emory University Hospital in Atlanta.



#### Illiteracy an obstable, study finds

Illiteracy appears to be an important obstacle to being diagnosed with prostate cancer early enough for effective treatment, according to a new study by Northwestern University Medical School researchers.

The study of 212 poor elderly men found that those who were diagnosed with advanced prostate cancer when they were examined for the disease were twice as likely to be unable to read above the sixth-grade level as those who

Participants were eligible for free prostate specific antigen (PSA) blood tests used to screen for prostate cancer and to general medical care, including a rectal exam that often detects an enlarged prostate. The problem was that men with the lowest literacy levels were unable to make medical appointments and otherwise negotiate their way through clinics and the health-care system to receive this free care, the study found.

### Federal openness workshop closed to public

WASHINGTON, D.C. (AP)

— The Obama administration is conducting a workshop on government openness for federal employees behind closed doors today, a private training session for freedom-of-information officials to learn about a new U.S. office that settle disputes between the

bureaucracy and the public.

The decision to preclude the public and the media from attending today's openness workshop left advocates scratching their heads, given President Barack Obama's campaign promise to make his administration the most transparent ever. "If they're getting marching orders, why shouldn't the public be there?" said Jeff Stachewicz, founder of Washington-based FOIA Group Inc., which files hundreds of requests every month across the government on behalf of companies, law firms and news organizations.

The workshop was organized by the Justice Department's Office of Information Policy for agency public liaisons, who serve as ombudsmen and who "play a vital role in the administration of the FOIA at each agency," the government said. It was to set procedures for

U.S. Office of Government Information Services, set up to resolve disputes over information requests between citizens and the government.

"We'd like to know, when they're training agencies, are they telling them the same thing they're saying in public, that they're committed to making the Freedom of Information Act work well and make sure that agencies are releasing information whenever possible while protecting important like individual privacy and national security," said Rick Blum, coordinator of the Sunshine in Government Initiative, of which The Associated Press is a member. The official in charge at

the conference, Melanie Ann Pustay, offered these reasons to explain why it was closed: She wanted government em ployees to be able to speak candidly, and the conference would be in an auditorium a the Commerce Department where she said a governmen ID was required to be admit

The AP and other new organizations routinely enter government buildings to cover the government.
